# ROYAL COURT THEATRE AND BRISTOL OLD VIC ANNOUNCE FULL CAST FOR AMY JEPHTA'S A GOOD HOUSE

Royal Court Theatre and Bristol Old Vic in association with The Market Theatre today announces casting for Amy Jephta's *A Good House* directed by Bristol Old Vic Artistic Director, Nancy Medina. The cast includes Kai Luke Brummer, Olivia Darnley, Mimî M Khayisa, Sifiso Mazibuko, Robyn Rainsford and Scott Sparrow.

A Good House is designed by ULTZ, with lighting design by Chris Davey, sound design by Elena E Peña and the composer is Femi Temowo. The casting director is Arthur Carrington, the associate director is Tatenda Shamiso, and the assistant designer is Shaquelle Newell-Grant. The voice and accent coach is Hazel Holder and the dramatherapist is Samantha Adams.

The production runs from Saturday 11 January 2025, until Saturday 8 February 2025 with press night on 17 January 2025, ahead of a run at Bristol Old Vic from 14 February 2025 - 8 March 2025.

"Once they've been here long enough, they're no longer squatters. Then they're simply... Neighbours."

In the quaint suburban community of Stillwater, a mysterious shack springs up from the dust with the inhabitants nowhere to be seen.

As speculation abounds, new residents Sihle and Bonolo are recruited by their neighbourhood to be the face of a campaign to demolish the shack in this biting satire of community politics.

A Good House is a thrilling and comedic new work, from writer Amy Jephta, about a couple who discover the limits of good neighbourliness and what is required to fit in.

Directed by Nancy Medina (*Trouble in Mind*, National Theatre), *A Good House* is a co-production with Bristol Old Vic in association with The Market Theatre, Johannesburg.

A Good House was originally co-commissioned by the Royal Court Theatre with the Fugard Theatre, South Africa.

**Concessions** – Enhanced for 2024 to include more performance days and price bands, Concession tickets are now available for previews, matinees and Friday performances on Band AA – C in the Jerwood Theatre Downstairs. **First Look Tickets (Previews)** - as most of the plays we stage at the Royal Court have never been seen before, the first few performances in front of an audience are the final part of a long creative process that starts with the playwright. Our First Look Performances, which are sold at a reduced price, are an integral part of the process. If you book tickets for a First Look Performance - the first three previews of a new play - you'll be asked for your feedback which is then shared with the artistic team during the preview period, potentially influencing the final piece.

**Under 30s Tickets** – We're also extending our scheme for young audiences, with Under 27s ticket prices now available for ages 30 and under, meaning even more people can access even more tickets at the £15 rate. A number of £15 tickets will be available for selected performances in the Jerwood Theatre Downstairs. Available on Band C & D tickets, subject to availability.

**Monday Tickets** – Every Monday, every seat in the house for Jerwood Theatre Downstairs productions is available for £15 from 9am online. A limited number are available in advance, subject to availability, to Friends and Supporters. The same price is available every Monday for Jerwood Theatre Upstairs productions.

10p Standing - We will start to sell standing tickets for 10p from 6pm on the day of each performance. Patrons buying standing tickets must stand in the windows provided on the side of the auditorium on the circle level.
