ROYAL COURT THEATRE ANNOUNCES MAY - DECEMBER 2025 PROGRAMME

Today the Royal Court Theatre announces six productions, running from May to December, to complete Artistic Director **David Byrne**'s 2025 programme. This includes four World Premieres and two touring productions, each featuring world-class artists and collectively showcasing the rich possibilities of what contemporary new writing can be.

The Royal Court also announces plans for the second iteration of our Open Submissions Festival later this year, an 18-month attachment for playwright Tife Kusoro and the opening of submissions for the inaugural Young Playwrights Award.

FOUR WORLD PREMIERES

- A deaf boy is killed in an occupied town and the next morning the whole population wakes up deaf in *Deaf Republic*, an expansive production about solidarity and collective resistance from world-renowned theatre company *Dead Centre* and Sign Language Poet *Zoë McWhinney*, based on the multi-award-winning epic poems by Ukrainian-American poet, *Ilya Kaminsky* (Fri 29 Aug - Sat 13 Sep 2025).
- Made entirely with sound and no words, Cow | Deer is a one-of-a-kind collaboration between Katie Mitchell, Nina Segal and Melanie Wilson, which radically decentres humans in an exploration of our relationship to animals and the environment, in co-production with the National Theatre of Greece (Thu 4 Sep - Sat 11 Oct 2025).
- Time fractures in **Nick Payne**'s **The Unbelievers**, directed by **Marianne Elliott**, designed by **Bunny Christie** and starring **Nicola Walker** as a mother facing the disappearance of her son, in this co-production with **Playful Productions** about family, memory and hope. (Fri 10 Oct Sat 29 Nov 2025).
- Studies show that women are statistically more likely to watch violent pornography than men. Sophia Chetin-Leuner's *Porn Play* explores women's relationship to porn through one academic's addiction, directed by Josie Rourke and starring Ambika Mod (Thu 6 Nov - Sat 13 Dec 2025).

TWO TOURING PRODUCTIONS

- Coming to London following its acclaimed national tour, Breach's new musical After the Act unpacks an act of oppression that sparked a generational riot. From 1988 to the present, the show remixes archival research and personal accounts of Section 28 as a turning point in LGBTQIA+ history. By Billy Barrett and Ellice Stevens, composed by Frew (Wed 21 May Sat 14 Jun 2025).
- Nassim Soleimanpour's boundary-pushing *ECHO*, a production about home and belonging, returns to the Royal Court following its debut in 2024, ahead of an extensive international tour. Directed by *Omar Elerian*, new performers taking to the stage without rehearsal include *Mel Giedroyc*, *Nish Kumar* and *Juliet Stevenson* (Fri 27 Jun - Sat 5 Jul 2025).

ALSO ANNOUNCED

- Now in its second iteration, the *Open Submissions Festival* will continue to provide brilliant new writing found through the Royal Court's open programmes with a professional platform (Tue 14 - Sat 18 Oct 2025).
- Playwright **Tife Kusoro** (*G*) will join the Royal Court on attachment for eighteen months, generously supported by **Peggy Ramsay's Playwrights '73 bursary.** As part of her attachment, Tife will write a new play, and will support the inaugural Young Playwrights Festival in July, inspiring the next generation of British playwrights.

David Byrne said, "The best thing about being Artistic Director at the Royal Court is the opportunity to support playwrights working in every form and texture for the stage. This season is the full feast of what new writing for the contemporary stage looks like now. Every production in this season is an unmissable piece of theatre, each bringing together world-class artists to present electric new work to audiences. Come and join us."

This summer the Royal Court also continues its commitment to supporting the next generation of playwrights through the inaugural **Young Playwrights Award**, for which submissions open in tandem with this announcement. The Young Playwrights Award is a call-out for plays from 13 - 18 year olds living or studying in London, culminating in a **festival of professional performances** at the Royal Court in July 2025. Winners will also be published by award partner **Nick Hern Books**, with trophies presented at a **prize-giving event** on 12 July 2025. The deadline for competition entries is **Friday 2 May**.

Tickets for all newly announced productions go on sale to supporters from 12 noon on Tuesday 25 March, to Friends and Good Friends at 12 noon on Thursday 27 March, and to the general public at 12 noon on Monday 31 March.

Abseiling lesbians! Queers in the classroom! Moral panic in the streets! And an act of oppression that inspired a generational riot.

In 1988, a law banned the 'promotion' of homosexuality in schools. Now, this electrifying new musical tells the story of Section 28 – and the teachers, pupils and activists who lived through it.

Exploring a defining moment in LGBTQ+ history, *After the Act* comes to the Royal Court following an acclaimed national tour. Created by multi-award-winning **Breach Theatre**, written by **Billy Barrett** and **Ellice Stevens**, with music composed by **Frew**.

Originally co-produced by Brighton Dome and Festival, HOME, New Diorama and Warwick Arts Centre.

Billy Barrett said, "We're delighted to be transferring After the Act to the Royal Court following its hugely successful UK tour. Since its original production, the show has been fine-tuned and scaled up, and sadly the story at its heart feels even more urgent - so we can't wait to share it with a larger London audience."

Ellice Stevens said, "To be transferring After the Act to the Royal Court feels incredible. This is a show which so many people have poured themselves into - from the performers in its various iterations, to the people we interviewed who gave us their stories. To now be given the platform to share it on the Royal Court stage feels like an immense privilege and an opportunity to be part of a wider conversation about LGBTQ+ rights. Since first performing the show in 2023, the relevance between Section 28 and today feels even more prominent. I feel so grateful this show continues to have a life at a time like now."

Nassim Soleimanpour's (*White Rabbit Red Rabbit*) critically acclaimed, sold-out hit *ECHO* returns to the Royal Court before an international tour. Directed by **Omar Elerian** (*Rhinoceros*), performers include **Mel Giedroyc, Nish Kumar** and **Juliet Stevenson** (full line-up to be announced).

A gunshot in occupied territory. A deaf boy is killed for disobeying orders he couldn't hear. The next day, the whole town wakes up deaf.

Adapted from the poems of Ukrainian-American author **Ilya Kaminsky**, *Deaf Republic* is an epic modern fable of war, humanity and collective resistance.

World-renowned theatre company **Dead Centre** make their Royal Court debut, collaborating with Sign Language Poet **Zoë McWhinney**. Told through a mix of spoken English, sign language, creative captioning and silence, *Deaf Republic* brings together an ensemble of deaf and hearing actors, aerial performers, puppetry, live cinema and poetry.

Ben Kidd said, "We are truly so excited to be partnering with the Royal Court on this project. Ilya's book is remarkable, and we have been working on the adaptation for a couple of years. We think Downstairs at the Court is the perfect place for it to start its journey. We have an amazing team with us, and together we hope to create something new and exciting, which asks questions about solidarity, freedom and silence, and how we must not, as Ilya puts it, "pretend that history is something that happens elsewhere, a misfortune that befalls other people... History is lying there in the middle of the street. Showing us who we are"."

A new experiment in performance from **Katie Mitchell**, **Nina Segal** and **Melanie Wilson**. Using only sound and no words, a quartet of performers and foley artists evoke the lives of two animals – a cow and a deer.

Cow | Deer is an invitation to enter the more-than-human world.

Co-created by Katie Mitchell (*Bluets, Anatomy of a Suicide*), Nina Segal (*Shooting Hedda Gabler, Big Guns*) and Melanie Wilson (*Oracle Song, Opera for the Unknown Woman*) in a major international co-production with the **National Theatre of Greece**.

Katie Mitchell, **Nina Sega**l and **Melanie Wilson** said, "Cow | Deer is an experiment in recalibration - away from speaking and towards listening; choosing collaboration over hierarchy; and looking beyond the purely-human into the more-than-human world."

Marianne Elliott said, "I am so thrilled to be returning to the Royal Court, where I started my London theatre career - as an Associate Director, under Ian Rickson. I am even more thrilled to be returning with this honest exploration of motherhood by Nick Payne - something we see quite rarely in my opinion. This continues my long association with designer Bunny Christie and actor Nicola Walker. I cannot wait to get started!"

Ani is a dazzling young academic with a secret addiction to violent pornography. As her career and relationships unravel in between lectures on *Paradise Lost*, can she confront her uncontrollable desires?

Funny, unsettling and honest, *Porn Play* marks the Royal Court debut of writer **Sophia Chetin-Leuner** (*This Might Not Be It*), in a world premiere directed by **Josie Rourke** (former Artistic Director of both the Donmar Warehouse and Bush Theatre) and starring **Ambika Mod** (*One Day, This Is Going to Hurt*).

Sophia Chetin-Leuner said, "Ever since I was a teenager, going to see plays at the Royal Court has shaped my ideals and purpose of who I want to be as a writer - so it's a terrifying

privilege to have Porn Play debuting here! I began writing this play to explore the effects of pornography on women, but it has evolved into something much more delicate and intricate over the years. And to have the support and championing of the incredible Josie Rourke has made me even more excited for the production - something I didn't think was possible!"

Josie Rourke said, "It's full of meaning for me to return to The Royal Court to direct a play that sits so squarely in the tradition and purpose of The Theatre Upstairs. The Royal Court is where I learned how deeply British Theatre values its playwrights and I'm honoured to be directing Sophia Chetin-Leuner's exceptional play and thrilled to be working with the remarkable Ambika Mod."
