The play contains strong language and explores issues of mental health, including but not limited to:

- depression and clinical depression
- isolation
- dependency
- suicide; attempted & death by suicide
- psychosis
- eating disorders and disordered eating behaviours
- self-harm (references to cutting)
- violence
- death
- sexual assault
- physical assault

Harm is referenced in the play but *not physically depicted.*

Opening Section

Approx. 0 – 25 minutes

References to isolation, depression and clinical depression, suicidal intentions, psychosis, self-harm (references to cutting), dependency, and disordered eating behaviors.

Loud noise in the form of raised voices/shouting occurs approx. 20 minutes in.

Middle Section

Approx. 25 – 40 minutes

References to self-harm (references to cutting), psychosis, sexual and physical assault and references to death.

Flashing lights are 30 minutes into the show and last approximately 2 minutes.

Loud noise in the form of raised voices/shouting occurs approx. 35 minutes in.

Final Section

Approx. 40 – 65 minutes

References to dependency and isolation, psychosis, suicidal intent, death by suicide.

Sudden loud noise of white noise / static occurs approx.. 50 minutes in.
